## Did you know that you have the right to refuse to dissect animals in Louisiana?

It's true! Each year, 10 million animals (including frogs, cats, and fetal pigs) are cruelly killed and then cut up in classrooms across the country—even though humane alternatives exist. Studies have shown that students who use alternatives to dissection perform just as well as—if not better than—students who cut up animals. You don't have to dissect animals! Explain to your teacher that you won't be dissecting and that the House Concurrent Resolution [H.C.R. No. 153 1992] gives you the right to say no to cutting up animals in Louisiana:

"Therefore, be it resolved that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to develop uniform alternative educational projects to be offered by city and parish school systems to students in elementary or secondary schools who choose to refrain from performing, participating in, or observing the dissection of animals, reptiles, or amphibians in a manner which would be destructive."

Dissection is unnecessary and cruel. Stand up for animals, and exercise your rights. Choose not to dissect.
