Explain to your teacher that you won't be dissecting and that the minister of education supports student choice in New Brunswick:

In New Brunswick, there are no requirements in our curriculum to complete dissections, actual or virtual. However, if teachers chose to include plant or animal dissections as an instructional technique, they would be expected to respond to students' concerns and to provide an option for virtual dissection.
