Studies have shown that students who use alternatives to dissection perform just as well as—if not better than—students who cut animals up. You don't have to dissect animals. Explain to your teacher that you won't be dissecting and that the Ontario Biology Curriculum gives you the right to say no to cutting up animals in Ontario:

There may be cultural sensitivities for some students in areas such as the use of biological specimens. ... Although it is impossible to anticipate every contingency, teachers should be open to adjusting their instruction, if feasible, when concerns are brought to their attention.
