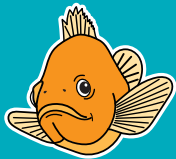

Answer: True. For example, mother cichlid fish do this.

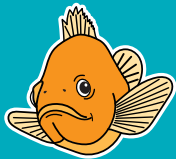

Answer: True.

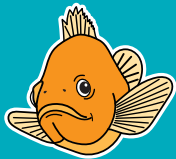

Answer: True. Fish are vertebrates, just like humans, dogs, elephants, and many other animals.

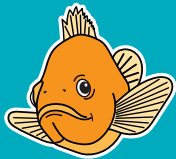

Answer: True.

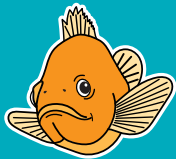

Answer: True.

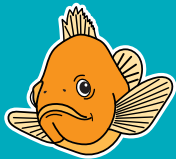

Answer: No. Fish suffocate and die when they are out of the water.

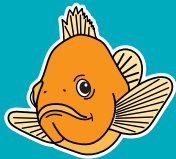

Answer: True. They're called "pharyngeal teeth."

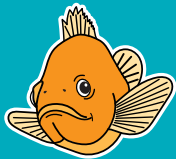

Answer: True.

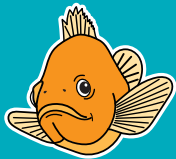

Answer: The anemone. Clown fish can hide from predators in the anemone's stinging tentacles. In return, they eat the anemone's parasites.

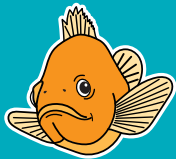

Answer: True. Scientists who study pain agree that the pain response in fish is nearly identical to the pain response in mammals and birds.

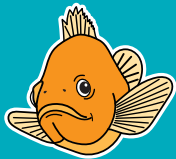

Answer: True. Cows sometimes choose their best friends the day they're born.

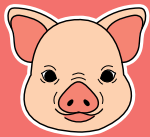

Answer: They can easily live to be 25 years old.

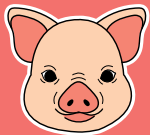

Answer: True.

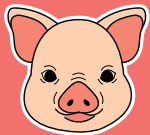

Answer: False. Pigs roll in the mud to cool off because they can't sweat like humans.

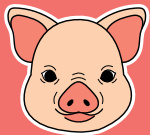

Answer: True. When given enough space, pigs are careful not to go to the bathroom near the places where they sleep or eat.

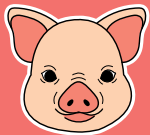

Answer: True. Pigs who live in sanctuaries, where they feel safe, often come running when they're called.

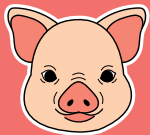

Answer: True. If you want to give a pig a belly rub, visit a sanctuary where pigs feel safe.

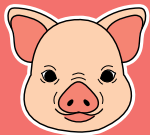

Answer: False. Pigs can pass the “mirror test”—they know that the reflection they see is themselves and not some other animal.

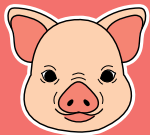

Answer: True.

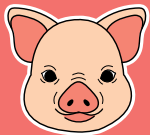

Answer: True.

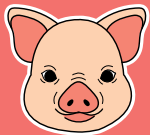

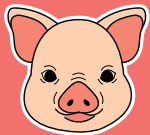

Answer: True.

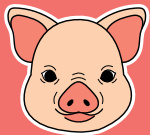

Answer: True.

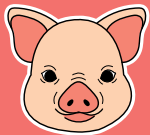
