
Animal Rights Summer Activity Choice Board

Never capture animals and take them out of their natural habitat.


If you hear fireworks, stay close to your animal companions so the sound of fireworks won't be so scary to them!

Put together an animal-rescue kit to keep in your family's car in case of emergency.


Make sure it includes a towel, a leash, a bottle of water, and a cardboard box or carrier.




Make a colorful sign to display in your window that encourages your neighbors to help animals. How about "Be Kind to Animals" or "Love Animals—Don't Eat Them"?
