



Animals are a lot like you. We all love hanging out with our friends and families. We want to be free to choose what we eat, what we do, and how we live. Did you know that places like roadside zoos, circuses, and marine parks take animals away from their families? Yup, they take them away from everything that they love and keep them in cages and tanks. It's not fair!

My orca friends live in concrete tanks and are forced to do tricks. That's not what they want. My buddy Milo the monkey, who lives in a roadside zoo, says, "Humans would hate it if they had to live like we do." He's right. Just imagine if you were grounded, even though you didn't do anything wrong, and you had to stay in a small room by yourself with nothing to do. Now, imagine that one side of the room had a big glass wall so that people could look at you whenever they wanted to. You wouldn't like that at all! Well, animals in roadside zoos and marine parks are grounded for life.

Like you, all animals have their own personalities. We can also do pretty cool things—like, did you know that I can run as fast as your car? Or that dolphin families have their own special languages? You have a really cool power, too—you can save us! Use your special power of **empathy**\* as you read our stories in this booklet and learn why animals don't like being in cages, tanks, or chains. 



## Awesome Animals! DID YOU KNOW?



CAMELS ARE BORN WITHOUT HUMPS. MOMS AND BABIES ARE VERY CLOSE AND STAY TOGETHER FOR YEARS. WHEN BABY CAMELS WANT THEIR MOM'S ATTEN-TION, THEY MAKE A "BAA" SOUND, JUST LIKE A LITTLE LAMB.

ELEPHANTS TALK TO EACH OTHER. THEY USE AT LEAST 70 DIFFERENT TYPES OF CALLS TO COMMUNICATE.






LIKE US, HORSES SHOW THEIR FEELINGS ON THEIR FACES. THEY ALSO HAVE REALLY GOOD HEARING AND EYESIGHT. THEY HAVE ALMOST 360-DEGREE VISION, WHICH MEANS THAT THEY CAN SEE ALMOST EVERY-THING AROUND THEM WITHOUT MOVING THEIR HEADS!



LIONS LIVE IN CLOSE-KNIT FAMILY GROUPS CALLED "PRIDES." LION MOMS ARE VERY LOVING. THEY RAISE THEIR CUBS TOGETHER AND TAKE CARE OF ORPHAN CUBS WHO NEED A MOM.

IN A HERD, ZEBRAS' STRIPES BLEND TOGETHER AND MAKE IT HARD FOR PREDATORS TO SEE ONE INDIVIDUAL ANIMAL. NO TWO ZEBRAS HAVE THE SAME PATTERN OF STRIPES-THEY'RE ONE OF A KIND, JUST LIKE OUR FINGERPRINTS.


IN NATURE, ORCAS SPEND THEIR WHOLE LIVES WITH THEIR FAMILIES AND SWIM LIP TO 140 MILES A DAY. BUT MANY OF THE ORCAS AT SEAWORLD WERE TAKEN AWAY FROM THEIR FAMILIES. THEIR TANKS ARE SO SMALL THAT THEY WOULD HAVE TO SWIM LAPS OVER 4,000 TIMES A DAY TO GO THE SAME DISTANCE AS THEY WOULD IN THE OCEAN.

IN CAPTIVITY MAKES ANIMALS LIKE ORCAS SAD.





ANIMALS IN ROADSIDE ZOOS OFTEN LIVE IN SPACES THAT ARE THOUSANDS OF TIMES SMALLER THAN THEIR REAL HOMES, PEOPLE ARE ALWAYS STARING AT THEM, AND THEY FEEL FRUSTRATED, SAD, AND LONELY. THEY CAN'T RUN, PLAY, OR EVEN CHOOSE THEIR FRIENDS.



ALL WILD TIGERS LIVE IN ASIA.



TIGER MOTHERS CAN HAVE UP TO SIX CUBS AT A TIME! THEY SHOW THEIR CUBS HOW TO DO EVERYTHING. IT TAKES ABOUT A YEAR AND A HALF BEFORE THEY CAN FIND FOOD ON THEIR OWN. THEY STAY WITH THEIR MOMS UNTIL THEY'RE 2 OR 3 YEARS OLD.





CLIBS SPEND MOST OF THEIR TIME PLAYING WITH EACH OTHER AND LEARNING HOW TO FIND FOOD BY PLAYING HIDE-AND-SEEK WITH THEIR MOM.



TIGERS ARE SO COOL! THAT'S WHY I WANT TO SEE THEM UP CLOSE.



ANIMALS IN CIRCUSES ARE TOO SAD TO BEHAVE NOR-MALLY, BECAUSE THEY'RE KEPT IN CAGES.





I USED TO WORK IN A CIRCUS THAT USED ANIMALS. THAT'S WHERE I MET A BEAUTI-FUL TIGER NAMED SAM.

SAM HAS THE SAME STORY AS MOST ANIMALS IN THE CIRCUS. HE WAS TAKEN AWAY FROM HIS MOM RIGHT AFTER HE WAS BORN, AND HE NEVER SAW HER AGAIN.





TIGERS ARE REALLY SCARED OF FIRE, BUT SAM WAS EVEN MORE SCARED OF HIS TRAINERS, BECAUSE THEY HIT HIM EVERY TIME HE DIDN'T DO WHAT THEY SAID. ANIMALS IN THE CIRCUS DO TRICKS ONLY BECAUSE THEY'RE SCARED THAT THEIR TRAINERS WILL HURT THEM. BABY ELEPHANTS ARE CHAINED UP AND HIT WITH WHIPS OR SHARP METAL HOOKS.



HORSES, ZEBRAS, AND CAMELS ARE HURT, TOO.



BETWEEN ACTS, ANIMALS ARE KEPT IN CAGES OR PENS. USU-ALLY, THE ONLY TIME THEY GET TO BE OUTSIDE THEIR CAGES IS WHEN THEY HAVE TO DO TRICKS IN FRONT OF A CROWD.




SAM WAS FORCED TO LIVE IN A SMALL, DIRTY CAGE. HE HAD TO EAT, DRINK, SLEEP, AND EVEN GO TO THE BATHROOM ALL IN THE SAME SPACE.



ELEPHANTS ARE CHAINED BY THE LEGS SO THAT THEY CAN'T MOVE. SOMETIMES, THEY'RE CHAINED SO TIGHTLY BY THE NECK THAT THEY CAN'T EVEN MOVE THEIR HEADS.

CIRCUSES TRAVEL FROM TOWN TO TOWN. THAT MEANS THAT ANIMALS ARE LOCKED IN TRAILERS FOR DAYS AT A TIME, EVEN IN VERY HOT OR VERY COLD WEATHER AND OFTEN WITHOUT FOOD, WATER, OR VETERINARY CARE.





FOR ANIMALS, LIFE IN THE CIRCUS IS VERY DIFFERENT FROM THEIR NATURAL LIFE.





FEMALE ELEPHANTS STAY WITH THEIR FAMILIES FOREVER. MALE ELEPHANTS STAY WITH THEIR FAMILIES FOR 10 TO 15 YEARS.



CAMELS LIVE IN HERDS AND ROAM AROUND THE DESERT WITH UP TO 30 OTHER CAMELS.




### **IN THE CIRCUS**


TIGERS SPEND MOST OF THEIR TIME IN CRAMPED CAGES, SOMETIMES IN THE HOT SUN WITHOUT ANY SHADE OR WATER.



ELEPHANTS ARE TORN AWAY FROM THEIR FAMILIES WHEN THEY'RE STILL BABIES.



CAMELS HARDLY GET ANY EXERCISE AND HAVE TO GIVE RIDES ON THEIR BACKS.



#### **IN NATURE**

LIONS SPEND UP TO 20 HOURS RE-LAXING AND NAPPING TOGETHER EVERY DAY. THEY'RE MUCH MORE ACTIVE AT NIGHT.



#### **IN THE CIRCUS**

LIONS ARE FORCED TO DO TRICKS DURING THE DAY AND AREN'T ALLOWED TO HANG OUT WITH EACH OTHER WHEN THEY WANT TO.



ZEBRAS LOVE THEIR FAMILIES. THEY TRAVEL IN LARGE HERDS, GRAZING TOGETHER, AND WILL OFTEN FORM A PROTECTIVE CIRCLE AROUND ANY HERD MEMBER WHO IS IN DANGER OR GETS HURT.



HORSES ARE FRIENDLY ANIMALS WHO GROOM EACH OTHER AND LIKE TO BE AROUND OTHER HORSES.




ZEBRAS ARE OFTEN FORCED TO LIVE WITH OTHER ZEBRAS THEY DON'T LIKE, AND SOMETIMES, THEY FIGHT. THEY'RE SO MISERABLE IN THE CIRCUS THAT MANY TRY TO ESCAPE BUT END UP INJURING THEMSELVES AND OTHERS.



HORSES ARE TAKEN AWAY FROM THEIR FRIENDS. LOUD NOISES AND MEANINGLESS STUNTS SCARE THEM, AND IT'S EASY FOR THEM TO GET HURT.







#### WHAT YOU CAN DO!

DON'T GO TO CIRCUSES, ROADSIDE ZOOS, MARINE PARKS, QUESTIONABLE AQUARIUMS, OR ANY OTHER ATTRACTION THAT EXPLOITS ANIMALS! IF PEOPLE STOPPED PAYING TO SEE TIGERS, ZEBRAS, AND OTHER ANIMALS, THESE PLACES WOULD STOP USING THEM. WE NEED TO LET THESE PLACES KNOW THAT WE DON'T WANT ANIMALS TO BE USED FOR OUR ENTERTAINMENT.



ASK YOUR PARENTS TO TELL LOCAL OFFICIALS THAT THEY DON'T WANT TO GO TO CIRCUSES THAT USE ANI-MALS AND THAT THEY WANT TO SEE ANIMAL CIRCUSES BANNED!



SPEAK UP FOR ANIMALS! TELL YOUR FAMILY AND FRIENDS WHY ANIMALS SHOULD BE FREE!



LEARN HOW YOU CAN HELP ANIMALS. CONTACT GROUPS THAT PROTECT AND CARE FOR THEM.




